

ALBERT CASSELL (1895-1969)



About:

- Born in Towson, MD
- Designed in Colonial Revival Style
- Acted as Howard University's official architect from 1922 to 1938; responsible for 1930 Master Plan for expansion and other campus buildings

- Founders Library, 500 Howard Pl NW (National Historic Landmark and National Register)
- Mayfair Mansions, 3819 Jay St NE (DC Inventory and National Register)
- Odd Fellows Temple, 1851 9th St NW (Within Greater U St Historic District)

About:

- Born in Washington, DC
- Designed in Classical, Renaissance, and Tudor Gothic Revival; Late Victorian styles
- Completed architecture apprenticeship under Alfred Mullett

- Victor Building, 724-26 9th St NW (DC Inventory)
- Second National Bank, 1331-33 G St NW (DC Inventory)



- Born in Taunton, England
- Designed in Second Empire, Italianate, and Greek Revival styles
- Worked as Supervising Architect for the U.S. Treasury, 1863-1874

- Baltimore Sun Building, 1317 F St NW (DC Inventory and National Register)

- Designed over 440 apartment buildings


