MISSION STATEMENT

The Preservation Initiatives (PI) Grant Program provides matching grants to individuals and non-profit organizations for preservation planning, research, outreach/education, and bricks and mortar projects related to historic and cultural sites. These grants are intended to help stimulate public discussion, introduce the public to preservation concepts and techniques, make technical expertise accessible, and encourage partnerships.

GRANT CYCLE & DEADLINES (2023)

Awarded projects must be completed within one year of signing the grant agreement.*

- December 1, 2022: Application opens
- March 1, 2023: Application closes NO EXCEPTIONS

After the application closes, the review process begins. All grantees will subsequently be notified of whether or not they are receiving a 2023 PI Grant. Successful grantees will then sign a grant agreement.

*Bricks & Mortar projects are allowed up to two years for completion.

PRESERVATION INITIATIVES FUND: BRIGHTWOOD CAR BARN

GOAL

The goal of the fund is to provide the widest possible distribution of funding to the **Brightwood Community and Ward 4** of the city to enhance the citizens' knowledge and understanding of **historic resources** in the community that add to the area's unique cultural heritage.

SOURCE

The Brightwood Car Barn Preservation Initiatives Fund is supported by mitigation funding paid by the owner of the building, Missouri Avenue Development Partners, LLC, as a result of the demolition of the Brightwood Car Barn in 2012.

Develop strategies for the preservation of a historic site.

\$5,000-\$10,000 25% Match Required



Support for research efforts of a historic property/site.

\$5,000-\$10,000 25% Match Required





Programs or educational material related to historic sites that actively engage & educate the public.

\$5,000-\$10,000 25% Match Required

Work that physically preserves a historic property (must be a designated historic landmark).

\$10,000-\$50,000 100% Match Required
