ROMULUS C. ARCHER

(1890-1968)

- Born in Norfolk, VA
- Designed in Colonial Revival and Modern styles
- Second African American architect registered in Washington, DC (1926); also registered in Maryland, Virginia, and North Carolina

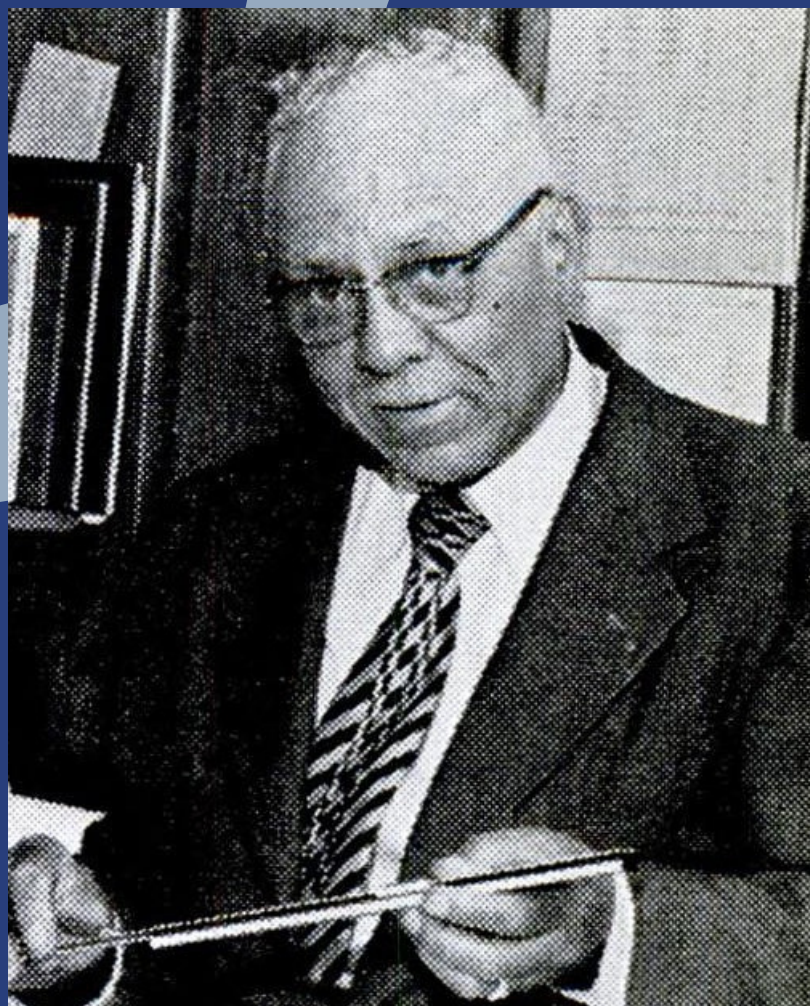

- Born in Washington, DC
- Designed in Gothic Revival and Queen Anne styles
- First practicing African American architect in Washington, DC

- Acted as Howard University's architect from 1922 to 1938; responsible for 1930 Master Plan for expansion and other campus buildings

- Designed in Colonial Revival, Art Moderne, and Art Deco styles
- Designed the first government-funded housing complex (Langston Terrace) in DC; second in the U.S.
